Saint-Goal Church

In the heart of the Ria d'Étel, on the heights of the Baie de Locoal, stands the church of Saint-Goal, built on the presumed site of its patron saint's hermitage. Transferred in 1037 to the Benedictines of Redon Abbey, the monastery became a priory. A chapel was built in the 11th / 12th century....

Chapelle Sainte-Barbe

This rectangular chapel features buttresses with recesses and pinnacles, crosses and rampant cabbages. It has a square bell tower above the west door, which is framed by belfries. One of the south windows features a stone pattern in the shape of a fleur-de-lis, a very rare motif in the region,...

Saint-Guillaume chapel

Rebuilt in 1885, its western facade features a small, low coved door surmounted by a small niche and a blind rose window. There is a door and two windows on the north façade, and three windows on the south façade, all with 19th-century stained glass.

Lann Groez chapel

It has a full-length granite bench and a door with decorated pilasters dating from the late 16th century. Wooden altar behind which is an altarpiece-lambris. On the sides, two false niches with no statues. In the south wall, a shelf in a niche framed by 16th-century columns with capitals.

Sainte-Avoye chapel

This monument impresses by its size and physiognomy. The chapel houses a rare piece: a polychrome, Renaissance-style rood screen, entirely carved. Made of oak, it separates the choir from the nave, delimiting the space reserved for lords and clergy (the choir) from that reserved for the faithful...

Saint-Quirin chapel

Dating from the 17th century, the chapel contains what is considered to be the finest classical altarpiece in Morbihan. Constructed in tufa and Maine marble, this masterpiece, listed as a Monument Historique, is attributed to the masters of Lavallois. The chapel is placed under the patronage of...

La Chartreuse was built following the Battle of Auray, which pitted Jean de Montfort against his cousin and rival Charles de Blois for the Duchy of Brittany. The confrontation cost Charles de Blois his life and put an end to the War of the Breton Succession. In 1382, Jean IV de Montfort, now Duke...

Chapelle Notre-Dame des Fleurs

Facing the bay of Plouharnel, this 16th-century chapel is listed as a Monument Historique. enlarged in the 18th century, it was damaged during the Revolution and the Second World War, and has since been restored. the chapel houses a fine collection of furnishings, the most remarkable of which is an...

Chapelle du Saint-Esprit

The Duke of Brittany, Jean II, crowned in Rennes in 1286, appreciated Auray. He is said to have founded a chapel of the Holy Sepulchre. It was located to the south-east of the present building. It still existed in the 18th century and housed a recumbent statue of Christ. Architects distinguish two...

Saint-Gildas Church

Saint-Guérolé chapel, fountain and cross at Coët à Tous

Built in 1851, it replaces a building (bearing the same name) built in 1785 below the hill (date inscribed on a stone of the current bell tower). A sarcophagus was found near the 1766 chapel. Legend had it that it belonged to Saint-Guérolé. In reality, however, the identity of the coffin's...

Church of Notre-Dame de Kerdro

With its Romanesque choir and capitals, this church is an important example of mid-Medieval Romanesque architecture. It features two 17th-century altarpieces, and the nave was enlarged in the 19th century. Several elements and parts of the building are listed as Historic Monuments. Open every day...

Chapelle St Germain

It has been restored several times. The date 1635 can be read on the chevet wall, against which stands an altarpiece made of rectangular compartments, with a square painting depicting the Repentance of Saint Peter in the center. There are several side niches with statues.

Chapelle Notre-Dame de Recouvrance

Parallel to the parish church, the Notre-Dame de Recouvrance chapel, listed as a historic monument, dates from the 16th century. Dedicated to sailors, the chapel is dedicated to Notre-Dame de Recouvrance. The chapel was a place of pilgrimage for seafarers' mothers and wives who had no news of their...

Saint-Goal chapel

Saint-Méen chapel

Built in the 16th century and listed as a Monument Historique, the Saint-Méen chapel is notable for the presence of a seigneurial chapel to the south of the choir. It boasts remarkable stained glass windows, including the choir window illustrating the Passion of Christ, dated 1556 (listed as a...

Saint-Cado chapel

Located on the famous island in the Rivière d'Étel and the oldest religious building in the commune, the chapel's history, architecture and exceptional setting make it a major, lively site for worship, heritage and tourism. Open to the public every day, or on the occasion of masses or cultural...

Saint-Sauveur chapel

It retains its typical Breton Renaissance appearance. The western facade features a molded round-arched doorway, and the original bell tower dominated by a short spire. The southern facade retains its long wall bench and a round-arched door between two flat pilasters, and three windows, one of...

Champ-des-Martyrs

The site is a memorial to the Royalists who were shot following the landing at Quiberon in 1795. The 19th-century expiatory chapel is listed and accessible daily, but the chapel is closed.

Sainte-Brigitte chapel

The wooden altar table is supported by two granite pillars, and a cross houses a bas-relief of Saint Face. Former statues of Saint Brigitte and Saint Roch. The fountain is located below the chapel to the southeast, and bears the date 1864.

Saint-Fiacre chapel

Located in the heart of the village of Trélécan, the chapel was built in the 15th century and has undergone various alterations over the centuries. The chapel has two choirs separated by two arcades resting on a pillar engraved with the date of construction in Roman numerals and Gothic...

Saint-Laurent chapel

Built in the 16th century in the flamboyant Gothic style, the interior contains statues, an ancient bell and a marine ex-voto. Open year-round, 10am-6pm. Pardon on 2nd Sunday in August.

Saint-Sané Church

The most striking feature is the altarpiece in the south chapel, which depicts the scene of the beheading of St. John the Baptist in starkly realistic relief. Chapelle Notre-Dame de la Route

Notre-Dame de la route chapel was built in 1963 from the stones of ruined local chapels. It's a modern chapel in a green setting. The chapel is the work of architect Yves Guillou, who headed one of Brittany's leading architectural firms. He is considered the architect who modernized Brittany. The...

Chapel of the Seven Saints

Refurbished in 1899. It soon fell into disrepair, and attempts to protect it only accelerated its decline. At the end of the 20th century, an association took charge of the building and turned it into the beautiful edifice we see today, with its exposed semicircular roof frame. The pediment bears a...

Chapel of Notre-Dame de Locmaria

The Notre-Dame de Locmaria chapel, listed as a Monument Historique, is the oldest religious building in the commune. It features a 15th-century polychrome roof frame, which was restored in 2009. The frame and paintings are exceptional for their rarity, and the decor as a whole is remarkable for...

Sanctuary of Sainte-Anne d'Auray

The history of Sainte-Anne d'Auray is said to have begun in the 17th century, with the apparitions of Saint Anne, mother of Mary, to Yves Nicolazic, a pious village ploughman. At the time, Ste-Anne d'Auray was a hamlet called Ker Anna, "Anne's village" in Breton. The news spread throughout Brittany...

Saint-Maurille chapel

The choir window bears the date 1659, but there must have been an earlier chapel. The chapel is dedicated to Saint Maurille, but three other saints are also celebrated here: Saint Mamert, Saint Adrien, whose polychrome wooden statue depicts him holding his entrails in his hands, and Saint Durlo....

Plumergat is one of Brittany's earliest parishes, created around the 6th century when Bretons from the Isle of Brittany (now Great Britain) immigrated to Armorique (now Brittany). Christianity has left its mark on the commune, which still boasts 11 churches and chapels. In fact, it's nicknamed "the..."

Church of St Peter and St Paul

Dating back to 1755, the granite bell tower features a square tower topped by an octagonal section ending in a lantern. The aisles were added to the nave in 1832, giving it its current appearance. A cross is leaning against the south gable, its granite base bearing the date 1851.

Chêne Bé-Er-Sant (Saint's Tomb)

In the heart of the Floranges forest, shoes are placed at the foot of an oak tree. Accessible daily via the D779 between Camors and Bieuzy-Lanvaux.
